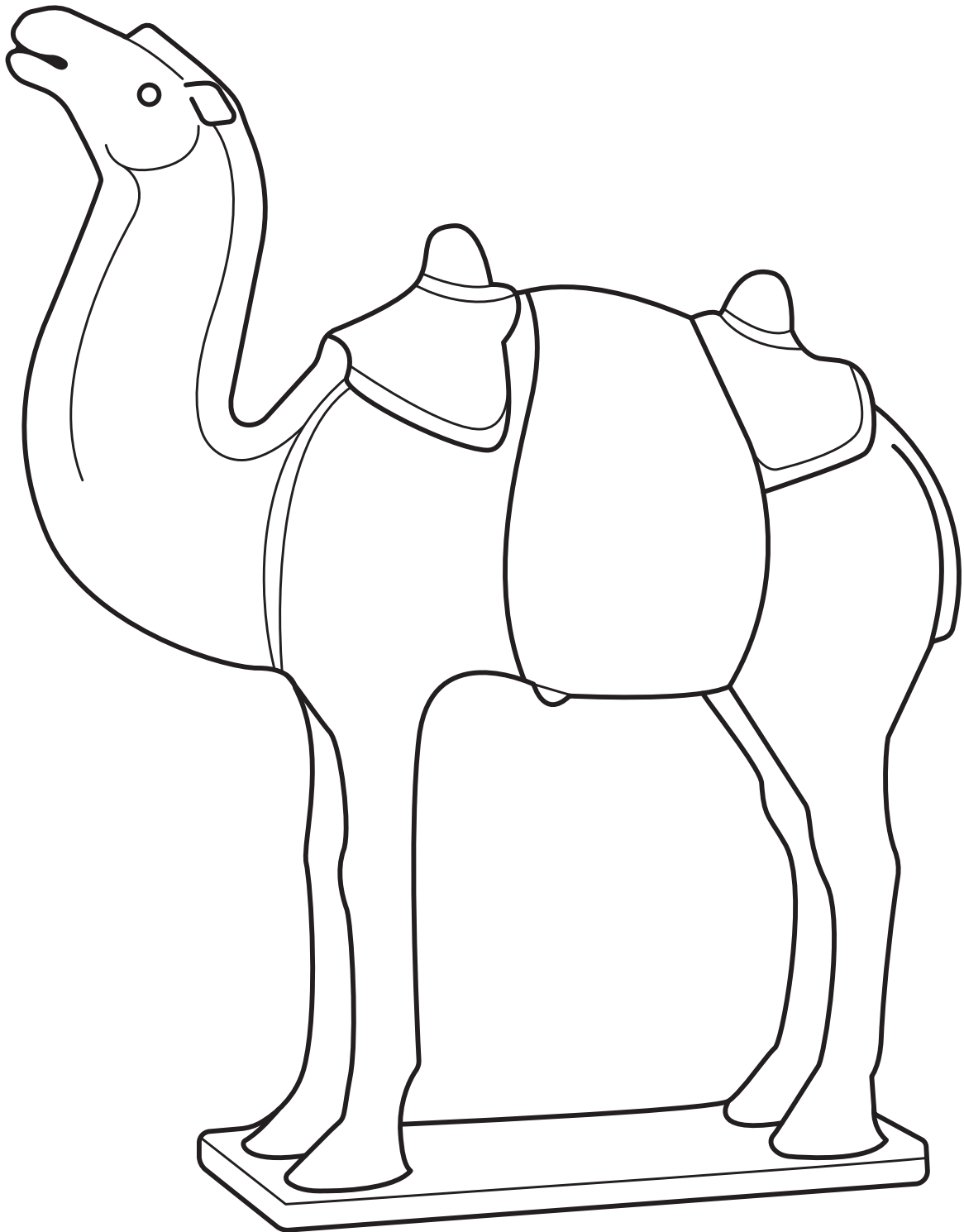
Imagine
