School Field Trips

Visit CHRYSLER.ORG/LEARN/EDUCATORS/SCHOOL-TOURS to schedule a tour.

Research shows a single museum visit can impact students' creative and critical thinking, cultural empathy, and emotive recall. Bring a group of students to the Chrysler Museum of Art this school year for a truly memorable experience. With a range of subjects and formats, choose an art adventure that connects the classroom curriculum to artwork from around the world. Your students will share ideas, enjoy a new environment, and leave making fresh connections.

THINGS TO KNOW:

- Field trips to the Chrysler Museum of Art are FREE. Inquire about transportation and/or substitute support.
- Please book your tour at least three weeks in advance.
- We love large groups! Groups (up to 60 students) will be divided. Bring one adult for every ten students. Staggered itineraries allow us to accommodate groups doing a tour and workshop.
- The Museum opens at 10 a.m. Most guided tours are 45–60 minutes, depending on the topic. Artmaking workshops, Perry Glass Studio demonstrations, or self-guided activities would be in addition to the guided tour time.
- Artmaking workshops, a trip to the Perry Glass Studio, or Sketching in the Galleries are subject to availability, book as soon as possible.
- We aim to please, but with such a vast collection, it is impossible to "see it all." Expect to see six works of art on any guided tour. If you want to see something specific, just let us know.
- Self-guided tours are welcome—please tell us in advance.
- Please keep backpacks on the bus. Any bag larger than 11"×17" will be searched. Large items may be kept in a locker.

IDENTITY AND IMAGE

Tuesday, September 19 AGES 13–17

Discuss ways artists use images to present identity in *Reckonings and Reconstructions: Southern Photography from the Do Good Fund.* Create a two-dimensional work of art to show who you are and how you show up. **\$8 | \$15**

REPETITION AND REDUCTION PRINTS

Tuesday, November 14 AGES 13–17

Create an image by carving it into a soft surface, then print. Continue to remove material to add layers and interest to your work of art. Leave with a multicolor set of prints. A trip to the Works on Paper Center will be an exciting part of this session, where student artists can access prints from the Museum's collection as sources of inspiration.

QUICK CASTING AND

Tuesday, February 20 AGES 13–17

Cast one of your fingers using plaster and everyday mold-making material. Transform wire into a three-dimensional sculpture.

CLAY CREATIONS

Tuesday, April 16 AGES 13–17

Experiment with air-dry clay to bring an idea into three dimensions. Combine wire armatures with clay to add strength and stability when going large.
