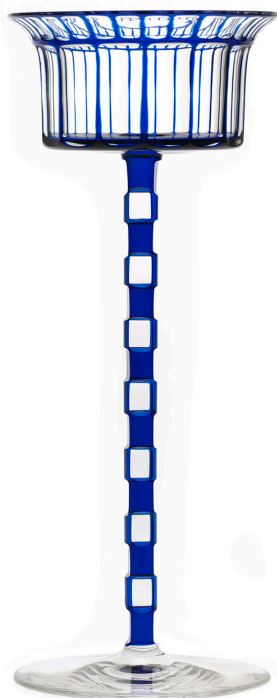
Are these artworks symmetrical? Draw a line of symmetry like you see on the bottle. Circle the work of art that is not symmetrical.



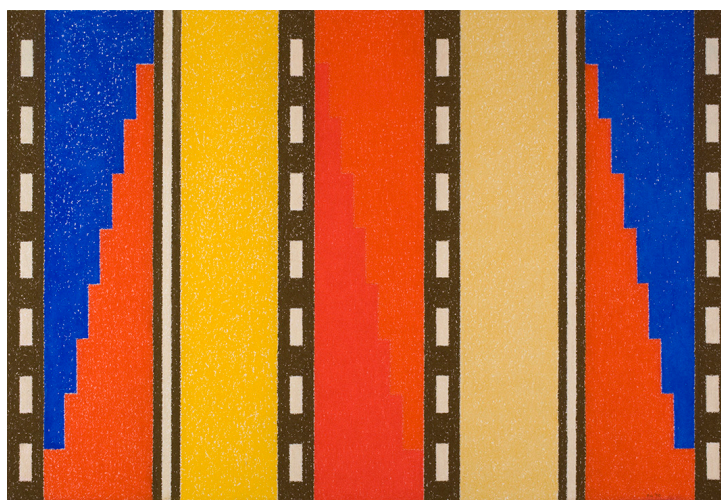
